How to Tune a Guitar (step-by-step) NEEDED: Guitar + Tuning instrument (i.e. Electric Tuner or Tuning App)

Step #1 in playing guitar well is making sure you are in tune! A good guitar player still sounds bad when he is playing a guitar out of tune. Below is a step by step guide on how to tune your quitar.

Know the Notes

The standard tuning for guitar is EADGBE (visual of headstock with names of notes)

Find the Tuning Keys

To tune the guitar you will tighten and loosen the tuning keys on the headstock of the guitar. Follow each sting up to its tuning key. Tightening the string raises the pitch and loosening the string lowers the pitch.

Playing Position

Sit down and put the guitar in playing position on your lap.

Begin Tuning

Start by tuning the Low E string!

By Eyes

Use an electronic tuner or tuning app to match the low E string to E with the tuner. Continue this process with the rest of the strings.

By Ears

Use an electronic tuner, tuning app, piano, or pitch pipe to hear the correct pitch. Match the pitch of your low E string to the pitch of the sound of the tuner. piano, pitch pipe, etc.

Use tuning reference device to match ADG strings by ear OR match each string to the pitch of the sting above it at the 5th fret.

Use tuning reference device to match B string by ear OR match the B string to the pitch of the sting above it at the 4th fret.


Use tuning reference device to match the high E string by ear OR match each string to the pitch of the sting above it at the 5th fret.


Note: Loosen the string a bit before tuning. It's easier to tune by ear when you tighten up to the correct pitch




